



OPTION 2: From your home **USING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT!**

STEP 1

Apply for an absentee ballot to be mailed to your home.

- Most people will get an application form in the mail. Fill it out and send it back.
- If you don't get an application form in the mail, that's okay. You can print one from this website:
http://www.sos.state.oh.us/sos/upload/elections/forms/Absentee_Request_06-2014.pdf
- You can also call your county Board of Elections and ask them to send you an absentee ballot application form.

STEP 2

Receive your ballot and fill it out! Make sure to vote in all the races!

STEP 3

Fill out the return envelope for the ballot completely.

STEP 4

Stamp and mail* your ballot back to YOUR COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS as soon as you can.

The deadline to get your ballot in the mail is Monday, November 7.**

STEP 5

Track your absentee ballot.

- Make sure your county Board of Elections got your absentee ballot in the mail.

***Do not drop your absentee ballot off at your neighborhood polling location.**

****Election Day is TOO LATE to mail your ballot back. Your absentee ballot has to be postmarked BEFORE Election Day. But you can drop off your absentee ballot in person by 7:30pm on Election Day at the Board of Elections.**
