



Remember to bring acceptable voter ID with you when you

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY, NOVEMBER 8.

YES! ACCEPTED OHIO VOTER ID

- ✓ **Ohio driver's license** - even with an old address, but it can't be expired
- ✓ **State of Ohio ID** - even with an old address, but it can't be expired
- ✓ **Utility bill** - current with name and address
- ✓ **Bank statement** - current with name and address
- ✓ **Paycheck** - current with name and address
- ✓ **Other government document** - current with name and address
- ✓ **Military ID** - even if it's expired

"Current" means the document is dated within the past year.

NO! NOT VALID ID FOR VOTING

- ✗ **College ID card**
- ✗ **Out-of-state driver's license**
- ✗ **Passport**
- ✗ **Voter registration card**

If you don't have ID with you:

You will vote a provisional ballot. You must provide the last 4 digits of your SSN or your driver's license or state ID number. You will not have to go to the Board with any other ID after Election Day as long as you provide one of these numbers.

College ID - special notes

In addition to the above IDs:

- Public university students - a letter from your university with your name and campus address on it is acceptable ID.
- Private college students - your university can send you a "zero balance" utility bill and this is acceptable ID.

Remember:

You can vote a regular ballot by showing your Ohio driver's license with an **old** address on it!
