Dear Representative Lepore-Hagan:

Thank you for your recent letter requesting information related to the financial support provided to General Motors Lordstown by JobsOhio and the State of Ohio.

Since its inception as a separate private nonprofit corporation in July 2011, JobsOhio has not provided any financial support through its private grant or loan programs to General Motors. As you reference in your letter, however, the State of Ohio has provided public financial support through the following grant and tax credit agreements:

1. Tax Credit Agreement between the Ohio Tax Credit Authority and General Motors Corporation signed by the State on January 15, 2009;
 - a. First Amendment, signed December 17, 2009;
 - b. Second Amendment, signed June 20, 2014
2. Retention Tax Credit Agreement between the Ohio Tax Credit Authority and General Motors Corporation signed by the State on January 15, 2009;
 - a. First Amendment, signed December 17, 2009;
 - b. Second Amendment, signed June 20, 2014
3. Grant Agreement between the State of Ohio, Development Services Agency and General Motors LLC signed by the State on April 25, 2014

Per your request, we requested and have received from the Ohio Development Services Agency a signed copy of each of the agreements referenced above and provide them to you with this letter.

JobsOhio maintains an ongoing dialogue with GM leadership. Our primary objective is to get the facility back to productive use; if the allocation of another GM product line is not possible, we have and will continue to encourage GM to find a buyer that would utilize the facility. If that is the case, JobsOhio will be there to help facilitate that opportunity.
