Representative Bryant Kuhns's family roots start in the West End community where both her parents were born and raised. Christie's dedication to her community started at a young age. Despite humble roots, the Bryant children were encouraged to help those less fortunate.

As a teen, Rep. Bryant Kuhns received her first lesson in advocacy through her involvement with the Arts Consortium of Cincinnati—a public arts program that was a staple for children and adults in her community. When City Council budget cuts threatened the program, she spoke out. Her fierce advocacy on behalf of the beloved arts program spurred a lifelong commitment to folks in her community.

A Cincinnati girl, Rep. Bryant Kuhns graduated from Walnut Hills High School and attended the University of Cincinnati for her undergraduate degree. She went on to study at the University of Cincinnati College Of Law where she developed a passion for policy advocacy and its impact on working families. Bryant quickly became a force for advocacy in the Cincinnati community. She joined the Avondale Community Council, became President of the Board for the African American Chamber of Commerce, and was an advocate for women and minority-owned businesses. Rep. Bryant Kuhns was appointed to City of Cincinnati Planning Commission where she helped to ensure all city neighborhoods are protected. She was also a member and Field Representative for the Cincinnati Federation of Teachers.

Rep. Bryant Kuhns believes in an Ohio where workers are paid a good wage, where children can attend top schools—regardless of their zip code—and where families can live the American Dream. She wants to live in an Ohio where voting is encouraged and citizens feel empowered. She wants to live in an Ohio where a story like hers is not the exception, but the norm.
