



Dear Neighbor,

While the Ohio House may be in recess, my colleagues and I remain hard at work creating opportunities and protecting the liberties of all Ohioans. The start of August means getting back to school, getting back on our feet from the pandemic, and getting to work on redistricting.

In July, I introduced <u>Sarah's Law (HB 373</u>) which would require schools to create an individualized seizure action plan for each student enrolled in the school that is diagnosed with a seizure disorder. This commonsense legislation would not only make students safer, and give families peace of mind, it would equip teachers and staff with the skills to identify and triage students that experience a seizure while at school.

As the delta variant of COVID-19 spreads in the state of Ohio, cases continue to rise. The CDC encourages everyone in counties with high or substantial community spread to wear a mask indoors. This highly contagious strain can cause severe illness in those who are not vaccinated. Anyone over the age of 12 years old is eligible to get the vaccine.
