World Suicide Prevention Day & National HIV/AIDs and Aging Awareness Day

Falling on September 10th, World Suicide Prevention Day is a time to remember those who have been affected by suicide, to raise awareness of treatment options, and to focus efforts on improving access to these treatments for anyone who may need it. Communities should use this time to check in with each other and share mental health resources, such as the 988 Suicide Crisis Lifeline.

September 18th represents National HIV/AIDs and Aging Awareness Day. This day is meant to focus attention on issues faced by older Americans struggling with HIV/AIDs. Today, as a result of improved treatment, people with HIV/AIDs are living longer, healthier lives. This is why it is important to reduce the stigma around older individuals with the infection and promote prevention, testing, and treatment among aging populations.





Getting Ready for Winter – Home Energy Assistance Program

Winter is right around the corner, which means gas and other home energy bills will soon be on the rise. The federally funded Home Energy Assistance Winter Crisis Program helps eligible Ohioans that have been disconnected or are struggling to pay for their home energy bills. Eligibility is based on household income, with a maximum income of \$23,782 for one person, adding \$8,260 for each additional member. The steps to apply for this benefit are listed below.

- 1. Visit https://development.ohio.gov
- 2. Search Energy Assistance
- 3. Click Home Energy Assistance Program
- L. Click Complete an Application.

Biden's Student Loan Debt Forgiveness Plan

The Biden Administration recently announced their plan for forgiving student loan debt. Here are the key points of this plan.

- \$20,000 of debt forgiven if you went to college on Pell Grants
- \$10,000 of debt forgiven if you did not receive Pell Grants
- This forgiveness only applies to those earning less than \$125,000 a year
- Student loan payments will resume on January 1st, 2023
- Undergraduate loan repayment can be capped at 5% of your monthly income

Lake Erie Grant Opportunity

The Ohio Lake Erie Commission is looking for proposals for their new grant program, The Lake Erie Communities and Coastal Resilience Grant. This program will offer one year grants of up to \$250,000 for projects in the eight Ohio Lake Erie coastal counties. These counties include Ashtabula, Lake, Cuyahoga, Lorain, Erie, Sandusky, Ottowa, and Lucas.

Project proposals are due on October 3rd, 2022, and grant recipients will be announced later in the fall. Proposals should focus on coastal resilience and protection in Lake Erie, ideally with an emphasis on improving underserved communities. Free Internet Access from AT&T

As a new school year begins, AT&T is focusing on improving learning opportunities for all students by providing free internet to eligible households. This is made possible by a combination of AT&T's existing low-cost internet access program with federal benefits from the Affordable Connectivity Program. As a result, more students will be able to have access to reliable, high-speed internet.

To see if your household is eligible for this program, first apply for the Affordable Connectivity Program. This can be done at ACPbenefit.org.
