Transportation Budget Highlights

The 2024-2025 Budget for Transportation is \$13.5 Billion. The Governor has signed it into law. This bill takes effect July 1

- \$1 Billion for Rural Highway Construction
- \$74 Million in Public transportation
- \$50 Million for road improvements (Systemic Safety Program), and safety features for greater use of pedestrian walkways.
- Two person crew, Wayside Detector systems, Train Hazardous waste transportation report

Should Police Age Decrease

House Bill 84 and Senate Bill 53 lower the minimum age of police offers from **21** to **18.** House Bill 84 is currently in House Homeland Security Committee. Who Took My Money (HB 1)

House Bill 1 creates a flat state income tax rate of 2.75%. This would lower the income tax rate of wealthy Ohioans more than any other group. Ohioans making less than \$26,050 per year would continue to pay no income tax.

The state would make up for the lost income-tax revenue by ending some state property tax rollbacks, which stops \$1.2 billion per year in state payments to schools and Local Governments. The flat-tax rate would negatively affect your cities, your schools and roads. This will disinvest less into public library and resources that municipalities can use for police and fire departments. HB1 makes Ohio more reliant on property tax.
