I have been very busy within the district this September. I attended various city council meetings, joined in the Cleveland Walk to Defeat ALS Akron as well as the Friendship Circle Walkathon. I attended the Warrensville Heights High School Dedication, toured the Duma Inc. Meats Processor facility and was able to attend Hunt Institute leadership summit and engaged with experts and other legislative leaders and experts to improve early childhood education.

I have received hundreds of emails regarding the Anti-Diversity, equity, and Inclusion (DEI) bill SB83/HB 15. I will vote NO on SB 83 if this bill comes to the House floor. I have also seen all your emails on HB 197, The Solar Pilot and Development program.

October is filled with much to do. October 11th marks National Coming Out Day and the start of Early voting for the Nov. 7th General Election. We also celebrate Halloween and Global Handwashing Day (Oct 15th).

Ohio's House sessions were expected to begin but all previously scheduled sessions have been canceled so far. The Ohio Redistricting Commissions have unanimously voted to adopt new legislative Maps. The new House Map has a 61 Republican—38 Democrat advantage. The new Senate District Map has a 23 Republican—10 Democrat advantage.

#### Pet Friendly Tax Credit

Joint Sponsor: Rep. Sharon Ray

- Provides a Tax credit for landlords that allow companion animal
- The tax commissioner will compile and publish (tax department's web site) a list of landlords who claim the credit
- The Tax credit is not allowed unless the claimant provides the address of each unit that are permitted pets, and a copy of the landlord's policies.

#### <u>Demolish Academic Distress</u> <u>Commission</u>

Joint Sponsor: Rep. Lauren McNally

- Dissolves the Academic Distress Commission
- Returns School District power from the State back to local School Boards


# Redistricting: House and Senate
