• Reproductive Care Act – HB 343

To preserve the medical privacy and legal protection of pregnant patients and healthcare providers by bringing the Ohio Revised Code in line with protections provided in the Ohio Constitution.

Ohio Equal Pay Act — HB 115

To ensure fair pay for equal work.

Ohio Safe Homes Act— HB 143

To protect the home-security of survivors of domestic and sexual abuse.

Keeping Our Survivors Safe Act — HB 417

To keep guns out of the hands of domestic abusers.

• <u>C.R.O.W.N Act</u>— **HB 178**

To ensure protection against discrimination based on race-based hairstyles.
