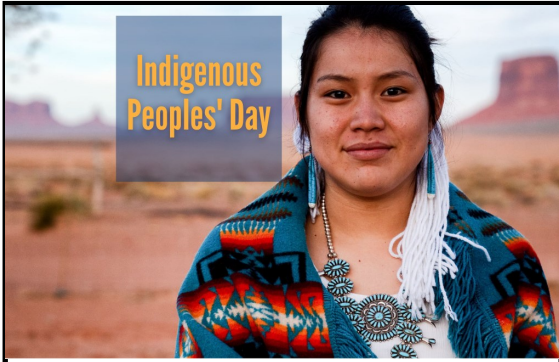

House Democrats Remind Constituents of the November 7th Election

- **October 10:** Voter registration deadline
- **October 11:** Early in-person & absentee voting begins
- **October 31:** Absentee ballot applications must be received by your board of elections by 8:30 p.m.
- **November 7: Election Day** (Polls open 6:30 am-7:30 pm)

Bill Spotlight: HB 35

HB 35, also known as the Scout's Honor Law, has been signed into law!

It was passed by the House on October 11th and was signed into law by Governor DeWine quickly after.

The Scout's Honor Law reforms statute of limitations for childhood sexual abuse so that survivors may participate in the Boy Scouts of America Nation Bankruptcy Settlement. There are nearly 2,000 survivors in Ohio and are going to participate in this historic settlement.

I hope that this is the first step towards tangible reform that helps survivors of childhood sexual abuse. It is so important that the path towards justice is clear of obstacles. We should have a justice system that helps survivors, not predators!



Bill Spotlight: HB 250

HB 250 is a common sense and bipartisan piece of legislation. For a student to earn the Military Enlistment Seal on their high school diploma, they either had to complete a J.R.O.T.C. program or enlist in the military after graduation.

This bill expands the criteria for the seal. Now those students appointed to a military academy or going to a university on an R.O.T.C. scholarship are also eligible for the seal.

We should be proud of our students that choose to serve our country in the highest capacity by serving in the military. It is a decision made with maturity and honor. This bill allows us to commend all our high school graduates that intend to serve whether it is right after high school or after college.

HB 250 unanimously passed out of committee on October 10th!
