Voting for Issue 1, which if passed would raise the threshold to approve a citizen initiated constitutional amendment to 60% from 50%, starts in July.

The deadline to register to vote is July 10th and early voting starts the next day, July 11th. You can vote early-in person by going to your county Board of Elections office. Absentee voting by mail also starts on July 11th. Absentee ballot applications must be turned in by August 1st at 8:30 pm. All absentee ballots must be postmarked by August 7th. On Election Day, August 8th, the polls will be open from 6:30-7:30 pm.

When politicians fail us, ballot issues give us the freedom to make decisions that affect our lives. Make sure your voice is heard by voting "NO" to protect our freedom to determine our future. #VoteNoInAugust
