Rep. Denson Tours Cincinnati's Historic Crosley Building

This month, Rep. Denson toured The Port Cincinnati's Crosley Building Revitalization project, a transformative initiative in the Camp Washington community. Originally built in 1929 as the manufacturing site for Powell Crosley radios, the building has a rich history but had fallen into disrepair. The Port, a public agency, is working to acquire and revitalize it as part of their broader industrial strategy, repurposing disinvested real estate for optimal use.

During the tour, Rep. Denson learned about The Port's mission to partner with various entities for equitable development, job creation, and community revitalization. The Port's role in bridging private sector interests and resident needs is crucial, ensuring a win-win scenario for everyone.





Following Issue 1's amazing victory, House Democrats introduced the Reproductive Care Act, legislation to reduce barriers to accessing abortion and reproductive healthcare. The bill will repeal existing statutes related to abortion care, such as mandatory 24-hour waiting periods, transfer agreements, and TRAP laws. It will also add protections related to patients and providers including data privacy, nondiscrimination, along with civil and criminal protection for evident-based care.

For years, the extreme majorities in Ohio's state legislature have been making it harder for patients to access abortion care and for providers to provide the proper, comprehensive care their patients need. The Reproductive Care Act is the first step in this multifaceted process to remove barriers to reproductive health care that exist in Ohio. Protecting women's reproductive rights happens when we work on reducing barriers to

care. House Democrats will continue to work to ensure patients and providers are protected.
