Urging Congress to End E-check

In 2020 I introduced legislation to urge the federal government to end E-check and again last year a similar resolution was introduced. In an additional effort to end E-check, I recently met with federal and regional EPA personnel to discuss more efficient improvements to Ohio's air quality. E-check is a burden to Northeast Ohio families - especially for low income households - and I will continue to strive for its elimination.

I was honored to present letters of commendation to Norton Police Officers Michael Guarnieri, Heather Bauer, and Sean Conner (pictured, left to right) for their heroic acts in December 2020, when they saved an elderly couple from a house fire.



Giving Back to the Community

As I have since 2010 I will again decline my benefits from the State of Ohio. The benefits package offered for my work as a State Representative totaled over \$16,000 of taxpayers' funds; including life, health, vision, and dental insurance, health and dependent care spending accounts, and contributions to an Ohio Public Employee Retirement System (OPERS) account. Public service is a labor of love and I cannot in good conscience accept added benefits when I am already adequately compensated.
