Dear Neighbor,

During March, the House of Representatives began their deliberation over the Transportation and Operating Budgets. Additionally, focus was put for two important education issues and of course, unemployment.

There were a number of bills, included HB 40 which I jointly sponsored with Rep. Jeff Crossman (D-Parma) to seek a Federal Waiver and cancel school state testing. Ultimately a different bill, HB 67 was passed to grant some relieve for our schools regarding testing, and will soon head to Governor DeWine's desk. Another important education bill working its way through the Primary and Secondary Education Committee is HB 34, which requires that students records by transmitted by one school to another within 5 days. This is critical because too often, student academic records, or IEPs do not immediately follow as a student transfers to another school. They lag behind for months, and some times are never sent. This can cause a student to repeat coursework, fall behind, or even be prevented from graduating. This is an important issue that needs to be addressed.

Ohioans have been struggling to access their Unemployment Insurance or PUA assistance due to an overwhelmed and poorly maintained system. There are a lot of issues that need to be addressed to improve and modernize Ohio's antiquated unemployment system. In an OpEd published by the Toledo Blade 2/24/2021, I laid out the issues plaguing Ohio and how we can begin to fix the system for all Ohioans. Through my work on the Unemployment Compensation Modernization and Improvement Council, I am hopeful we can propose meaningful solutions to help Ohioans.

Women such as Toledo born and gender norm challenging journalist Gloria Steinem, or Josina Lott, who in 1938 founded her own school in Toledo to help teach students with developmental disabilities, and efforts resulted in the expansion of dedicated education across the state. Women like Kamala Harris, who is the first Female Vice President of the United States. Women's History Month is also about future generations of women, and what the young girls of today will accomplish tomorrow. Their achievements will indubitably become the subject of future Women's History months.
