- House Bill 123: Designate Honor and Remember flag to honor fallen service members
- House Bill 224: Allows dedicated organ recovery vehicles to use lights and sirens when transporting organs
- House Bill 139: Increase assault penalties if the victim is a sports official

Funding Awards from ODOT's 2023 Safe Routes to School Program

This program provides resources, technical assistance, and project funding to encourage and enable students in grades K-12 to walk or ride their bike to school. Funding for eligible SRTS infrastructure projects include sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, traffic signal upgrades and other safety enhancements. Non-infrastructure projects include education materials, driver safety campaigns, walk and bike safety instruction and more.

The City of Lorain has been awarded \$ 498,000 in Fiscal Year 2026

- Improved pedestrian accommodations such as the removal and replacement of non-ADA compliant ramps, new sidewalks, new striping and signage, as well as speed feedback signs along Fairless Drive, Tacoma Avenue, and Goble Drive impacting two schools: Southview Middle School and Helen Steiner Rice Elementary.

The City of Lorain has been awarded \$120,000 in Fiscal Year 2024

- Lorain City School District will receive funding for driver safety campaigns near local schools, arrival and dismissal monitoring supports, and walk and bike events.
