Happy February! As we settle into 2024, I want to provide key updates in our district and around the statehouse. February is Black History Month, a time to celebrate the achievements and contributions of Black individuals throughout our history. Ohio House Democrats and the Ohio Black Legislative Caucus will be discussing the importance of Black History Month and honoring historic Black Ohioans all month long! On Wednesday, Governor DeWine announced a revised set of rules for OhioMHAS regarding gender transition care. The rules now only apply to the care of minors, not adults, expand options for mental health providers, and remove the requirement of having a medical ethicist involved in treatment plans. These revised rules come after OhioMHAS received 3,900 public comments. While these rules, coupled with the implementation of House Bill 68, are still detrimental to trans youth, they show that public pressure and engagement works. Thank you to all who took the time to submit comments!

I am continuing to advocate for bipartisan legislation that benefits all Ohioans. If you have any questions, concerns, or legislation you would like to advocate for, please contact my office! I look forward to continuing to serve District 11.

## District 11 Receives Investments

There are a lot of exciting investments happening in District 11! Infoverity, a professional services firm in Dublin specializing in data management services, received funding from the Ohio Tax Credit Authority to expand their location. The project is expected to create 65 new full-time positions and generate \$7 million in new annual payroll. This announcement is great for the local economy of Dublin, and we are looking forward to the expansion!

This week, Governor DeWine and the Ohio Department of Transportation announced that more than a dozen major local bridge projects will receive state funding to support rehabilitation and replacement work. The Trabue Road bridge was awarded \$843,079 to replace the desk and roadway surface, as well as to add new piers and new beam lines.

The Ohio House also passed House Bill 2 this week, which appropriated \$2 billion in state funds for economic development and community investments

that will help drive economic growth and generate opportunities across our state. These one time funds came from left over federal dollars during the first few years of the pandemic.

Franklin County received \$42 million in funding, including \$8 million for the Heritage Trail Expansion Project. This project will connect trails in Downtown Hilliard to Downtown Columbus. It will be a twolane, paved multi-use trail, perfect for running, biking, walking, and other recreational and active transportation uses!

The OTSCIF is different from the standard Capital Budget funding, which will be considered in the Senate over the next two months. If you have any funding requests, please reach out to the Ohio Senate! You can find your senator <u>here</u>. In addition, if you support the funds allocated through House Bill 2, we also encourage you to reach out to **Senate** President Matt Huffman as the Senate begins considering the bill.




