COLUMBUS – State Rep. Sean Patrick Brennan (Parma) announces Ohio's back-to-school sales tax holiday will be extended to ten days through 11:59 pm on August 8th. During the sales tax holiday, there will be no state or local sales or use tax on any tangible personal property priced at \$500 or less, dine-in meals in restaurants, or online purchases. Watercraft and motor vehicles, alcoholic beverages, and any item containing tobacco will remain taxable. "I was honored to vote for House Bill 33 to expand items that qualify and to extend the sales tax holiday. All of Ohio's families need relief from rising prices. This provides folks an opportunity to purchase school supplies in preparation for a successful school year. I encourage all Ohioans to take advantage of this tax cut," said Rep. Brennan. 

I was very excited recently when I got word from the Governor's office that he was going to sign House Bill 466. H.B. 466 establishes minimum standards for written real estate representation agreements between real estate professionals and homebuyers. In fact, under this legislation, parties will be required to enter into a written representation agreement before a seller may show a property or a buyer may make an offer to purchase a property.

Written representation agreements must include an expiration date, information on fair housing and blockbusting laws, whether the relationship is exclusive or nonexclusive, and terms of compensation.

After teaching American Government to middle and high school students for 30 years, I am literally living my life's work. If you have been keeping up on my work for you at the Statehouse, you will recall that H.B. 466 is a collaboration between me and my esteemed colleague Jean Schmidt (R-Loveland). She and I became fast friends in the State Legislature because of our mutual love of running. In fact, although I have run 115 full marathons, she has almost completed 200! What is particularly fascinating about this bill is the swiftness that it moved from introduction to the Governor in just a few months—a testament to working in a bipartisan fashion.

This law promotes transparency and protects all parties involved in the homebuying process. It will be especially helpful to new homebuyers by educating them on the various aspects of the transaction. I am honored to join Rep. Schmidt on this very

important and needed legislation.
