What's Going On with the Budget?



On July 1, Governor DeWine signed Ohio's FY26-27 Operating Budget, passed by the Ohio House and Senate, into law. Rep. Thomas voted against it because this is a harmful budget that prioritizes Ohio's wealthiest over kids and families.

Here's what it includes:

- An **income tax cut for the wealthy**, costing the state \$1.67 billion, while providing no relief for working Ohioans
- Vastly underfunding our public schools, which educate the next generation of Ohioans, and instead handing the Cleveland Browns' billionaire owner \$600 million for a new stadium
- Medicaid cuts that leave 800k Ohioans at risk of immediately losing their health insurance and that reduce critical funding for hospitals around the state
- Giving politicians more control over our kids' education by redesigning the State Board of Education. Now, board members will be appointed by the Ohio Senate, not directly elected by voters. This dangerous move subjects students to political agendas and interference.


Gov. DeWine used his line-item veto to remove several other harmful provisions from the final budget, including limits to school districts' ability to raise funds through levies, cuts to H2Ohio, and political censorship of library collections. The House of Representatives will consider veto overrides on July 21, for which they would need 60 votes. Even if the vetoes hold, this budget remains a far cry from one Ohioans deserve.

Rep. Thomas Wins:



Rep. Thomas' resolution (HB4) to designate September 19 as Ohio Stillbirth Prevention Day was signed into law by Governor DeWine! HB4 aims to increase awareness and resources surrounding this critical health issue.

Rep. Thomas is pleased to announce that his <u>School Bus</u>
<u>Safety Act (HB3)</u>, has passed the House floor and now moves on to the Senate! The bill holds drivers accountable, invests in safety measures, and empowers school districts to implement the most effective solutions for their communities.





Rep. Thomas applauds the passage of HB210, which protects against catalytic converter theft. The bill is similar to a 2012 ordinance that Rep. Thomas championed as a member of the Cincinnati City Council. His ordinance was among the first of its kind in Ohio. Today, Rep Thomas is "proud to see that what we started locally is now being expanded across the state".

New Bills

Spotlight - H.B. 359:

This bipartisan bill would create a "Joshua Alert" system for missing children with autism and other spectrum disorders. The Joshua Alert would operate similarly to the AMBER Alert, and was designed in response to the tragic drowning of Joshua Al-Lateef. Read more HERE

Spotlight - H.B. 247

This bipartisan bill, sponsored by Reps. Kevin Miller and Meredith Lawson-Rowe, would enact Avery's Law to address dog safety issues in response to several recent tragedies. The bill is based on an earlier version, H.B. 240, that was introduced by Rep. Thomas


