#### STATE of the STATE HIGHLIGHTS

#### **Families and Education**

- Expanding program for home visits. Support for pregnancy and new moms.
- Repeal State Tax on critical supplies for babies such as diapers, formula and wipes.
- Increasing the child tax deduction to \$2500 per child.
- Expanding money for childcare facilities and local child services agencies.
- Creating a state Dept. of Children and Youth.
- Increase Charter School funding and Choice Schooling funding.
- \$300 million for capital improvements for career tech facilities.
- Financial aid expansion to include community colleges and regional campuses.
- Expanded eligibility for scholarships for college-bound kids choosing Ohio universities.

# **Economic Development**

• Expanding on Innovation Hubs to put them in more cities around Ohio

### **Health and Human Services**

#### **Rules Governing 135th GA**

- Increased Transparency for the Public
- Restoring Order to Committees

Main takeaways include amendments to bills or substitution bills have to be submitted and published online by midnight the day before a committee hearing. This will increase transparency for the public and settle the chaos that happens at committee.

#### **Rejected Amendments to Rules**

- Requiring opening prayer to only be Christian prayers
- Allowing firearms on the House floor

The Democrats have members of other faith that this rule would exclude, not to mention the many other Ohioans across the state from other faiths who often attend session.

The Ohio Highway Patrol is our 24/7 security, including on the House floor. Guns on the floor for member safety is not necessary.

#### Roundtable on Home Healthcare Workforce Shortage

- In the next 10 yrs, we will need 230k additional workers in this space across the state
- In Mahoning County last year, on average, 215 people a month were not receiving vital care because of the shortage.
- Columbiana is was 100

This prevents people from aging with dignity, staying in their own homes, puts burdens on their families and much more.
