TREMONT CITY BARREL FILL

In October of 2022 a U.S. district court judge approved a decree to hold seven companies responsible to clean-up an estimate \$27 million worth of contaminants at the Tremont City Barrel Fill. The responsible parties, Chemical Waste Management Inc., Franklin International Inc., International Paper Co., The Procter & Gamble Co., PPG Industries Inc., Strebor Inc. and Worthington Cylinder Corp. are all being held liable for the cleanup, because they are either former owners and operators of the barrel fill or sent wastes to the site for disposal.

These companies are now required to work with the Environmental Protection Agency to present their findings and eventually, a remedial plan on how to remove the contaminants. I will stay on top of this process as the site is returned to its natural habitat. If you would like to learn more about the clean-up process you can visit the EPAs site at
