Happy March! It's been a busy couple of months with lots of budget hearings in most of my committees, so this newsletter is a two-month update!

We recently passed the bipartisan Ohio Transportation Budget, House Bill 54. The budget's appropriation of \$11.5B is a significant investment into the future of Ohio jobs, helping to connect the workforce to the worksite and improving roads, bridges, and transit systems across Ohio.

I am proud to be advocating for you in my ongoing work on Ohio's main operating budget for the fiscal years 2026-27, House Bill 96. Ohio has the resources we need to improve the lives of our citizens and communities. My priority is ensuring that our budget makes it easier to receive a quality education, start and grow a family, age with dignity, and earn a living that can sustain a high quality of life.

Despite the distraction of culture wars like limiting individual freedoms, attacks on our LGBTQ+ neighbors, restricting higher education institutions, and banning DEI, I remain focused on putting the people first. I am committed to working to improve the lives of all Ohioans by fighting for affordable healthcare, increased wages, and lowered property taxes.

March is Women's History Month! We celebrate and honor the women who fought—and continue to fight—for equality. From Susan B. Anthony to Harriet Tubman, American history is full of inspiring women who fought to create a more equitable America. Today, we continue to fight for Women's rights by protecting reproductive freedoms and closing the gender wage gap.

Senate Bill 1 Update

On March 19, the House Passed <u>Senate Bill (SB) 1</u>, the Higher Education Destruction Act. In my role of Ranking Member on the House Workforce and Higher Education Committee, I have been actively working to halt this harmful bill.

It is unconscionable that such a sweeping overhaul of Higher Education has been written with NO input from the three constituent groups who matter the most on this topic - students, parents and educators. It's undemocratic that something this important to the future of our state will have NO input from millions of Ohioans. NO input from the areas of Ohio with major economic engines who stand to be immediately impacted by the negative consequences of this bill. It's disrespectful that the voices of thousands who have come to this People's House to testify in opposition to SB 1 have been discounted.

At a basic level, this legislation is not the answer to a concern. It is reckless in the sweeping impact it will have by attacking working people, muzzling free speech, trampling student rights, BIG government overreach and destroying our economy.

In trying to solve problems that do not exist, SB 1 creates new issues that will increase costs, stifle growth, and prevent Ohio's young adults from reaching their full potential.

Since SB 1 was amended in the Ohio House, it will go back to the Ohio Senate again before it is able to proceed to Governor DeWine for his consideration.

Legislative Update

There are several budget bills that are making their way through the legislature, including the Main Operating Budget, the Workers' Compensation Budget, and the Transportation Budget. Transportation Budget - House Bill 54

The Transportation Budget (House Bill 54) appropriates \$11.5B, investing into the future of Ohio jobs, connecting the workforce to the worksite, and the bill will improve roads, bridges, and transit systems across Ohio. **Some provisions included in House Bill (HB) 54:**

- Provides \$8B in statewide highway construction and maintenance projects over the Biennium
- · Makes progress toward meeting the state's significant public transportation needs by appropriating nearly \$200M for public transit, including\$30M to continue the Ohio Workforce Mobility Partnership Program
- \cdot Authorizes the continued distribution of gas tax revenue to cities, counties, and townships across Ohio to support local road maintenance
- · Appropriates \$18M for Transportation Improvement Districts to invest in local infrastructure across the state
- · Protects construction workers on the highway by establishing the Road Safety Pilot Program to assess speed compliance in construction zones, but prohibits using traffic law photo devices for any purpose, including a citation, summons, or ticket
- · Adopts the Midwest Interstate Passenger Rail Compact, which creates the Midwest Interstate Passenger Rail Commission and earmarks \$25K in each fiscal year to pay for the costs associated with joining the compact
- · Continues funding commitments to the Brent Spence Bridge
