

# From the desk of Rep. Lawson-Rowe

Dear Neighbor,

House Bill 96, the state operating budget, is now in the hands of the Ohio Senate. I voted "no" on the operating budget in the House because, despite minimal improvements while in House committee, it still misses the mark for Ohioans.

Priorities in this budget, as passed by the House, dumps more taxpayer money into vouchers for charter non-public and private schools at the expense of the constitutional and bipartisan fair school funding formula, and authorizes a \$600M handout to billionaires to build a new Browns stadium outside of Cleveland amidst opposition by local leaders.

I am calling on the Ohio Senate to restore key provisions in Governor Mike DeWine's executive budget that fund childcare, public libraries, Medicaid, affordable housing, clean drinking water, and lead abatement funding.
