This spring, House Democrats unanimously voted "NO" on the state operating budget (HB 96). The GOP state operating budget is a broken promise to our district. From schools to seniors, this budget does not meet the needs of District 41. After the House voted "no" on this budget, the bill moved to the Senate. It is expected that the Senate will vote on the bill in the next week. Once the bill has been voted on, it will most likely be referred to conference committee. UNDERSTANDING THE STATE BUDGET PROCESS

The House went through and made changes to the Governor's proposed budget. A vote was taken on the House floor and the proposed budget (HB96) was then sent to the Senate.

Since the Senate received the House budget, they have made changes (amendments). The Senate is expected to vote on their version on the budget within the week.

Once the Senate's version of the budget is voted on, the House will receive their version of the budget to vote on. If the House does not pass the Senate version of the budget, conference committees will take place. If the budget DOES pass the House, it will be sent to the Governor to be signed into law.

After the conference committees occur, if both the House and Senate agree to the conference committee report, the act is enrolled.



JobsOhio Small Business Grant:

The grant offers up to \$50,000 in financial assistance to eligible small businesses that are looking to grow their partnerships.

What can the grant be used for?

- Trainings

Who is eligible?

- Have annual revenues of \$100,000 and \$25 million
- Operate within one of JobsOhio's 10 target industries with revenues from B2B sales.
- Have at least one year of operating history.
